



Once upon a time...


Ipoh became one of the richest tin-producing regions in the world during the 19th century due to the discovery of tin near the river.

Epu and Pulau were neighboring settlements on Ulu Kinta river bank. In 1879, Epu became the main village center and a police post was constructed.



Paloh is a Malay word meaning "palong," which refers to the gold mine where tin ore was mined.





1880s

The Panglima Kinta planned Ipoh town layout in 1886, building Ipoh Court House, roads, and hospital. A fire them destroyed half of it in 1892, offering opportunity for grid reconstruction.









lpoh has experienced rapid development since pre-colonization, with modernization contributing to changes in the physical features of the old town area.














Ties of Hope: Weaving Lives and Memories




IPOH'S PALETTE A Journey with a brush













Pocket garden between the site and UTC, and market placement close to bus stop and UTC for convenience.






Bridge connected to UTC for the use of the library and resting area by the UTC users.





Semi and private area for better security control specially at night.






The pocket garden works as a linkage to connect the UTC with the site, with a road only used for emergences.




Placing the spaces that needs more natural ventilation towards NE, and keeping the bridge as open as possible.

Reflection

The final studio project was an overall enjoyable experience, despite the challenges I faced along the way. One of the biggest hurdles was understanding the needs of the users on the site, which are the seniors. Figuring out what they wanted new in their space was difficult, as it involved introducing something unfamiliar while still respecting their comfort zones and preserving the essence of their heritage and communal spirit. However, this challenge pushed me to think critically, diving into deep research and actively listening to the interviews we did to uncover meaningful insights.

Another challenges I encountered was the time constraint, which required me to balance creativity with practicality. While I'm proud of the outcome, I feel there's untapped potential in the circular forms and the spatial volumes I incorporated. Given more time, I would have loved to explore these aspects further, experimenting with how they could create even more dynamic and cohesive environments. This limitation, however, taught me the importance of working efficiently under pressure—a valuable lesson I'll carry forward in my career.

I am deeply grateful to Ms. Hanani, whose guidance was instrumental throughout this process. Her expertise and thoughtful feedback pushed me to critically analyze my ideas and find practical solutions to the challenges I faced. From refining the spatial flow to addressing site-related issues, her tutoring steered me in the right direction when I felt uncertain.
